




Ahead by a nose

LATOYA AND MICHAEL JACKSON MAY HAVE SET BACK RHINOPLASTY A HUNDRED YEARS, BUT RECENT ADVANCEMENTS IN NON-SURGICAL NOSE RECONSTRUCTION HAVE REVOLUTIONISED THE PROCEDURE AND REDEFINED THE NOSE JOB.

Sneezer, sniffer, snoot, snout – whatever we call that smelling organ on our face, it's the second most looked at feature anywhere on our body, after the eyes. And with this sort of attention, it's no wonder so many of us choose to tweak our beak.

Non-surgical nose reconstruction has revolutionised procedures for those unsatisfied with their sniffers. Forget the general anaesthetic, the black eyes, the weeks of downtime and the traditional expense. Non-surgical nose correction is painless, quick, effective and affordable.

How does it work?

Fillers are injected into the nose to tweak and mould any lumps and bumps. This can narrow a wide nose, widen a narrow nose; you can go for cutesy button or strong and straight – it's

up to you.

How long does it take?

About an hour. You can even do it on your lunch break and go straight back to work!

How long before results are visible?

Immediately. You walk out of the clinic with an instant result. There is little or no downtime.

What specific corrections can be performed?

- Straightening a crooked appearance and smoothing out bumps, dips or unevenness in the cartilage.
- Elevating the tip of a hooked nose resulting in a strong, straight tip.
- Wide or flared nostrils can be made to appear slimmer and smaller.
- A flatter nose can be made taller.
- Sleep compression lines and allergy lines

across the tip of the nose can be filled and smoothed out.

- A longer nose can be made to look shorter or smaller.

How long does it last?

About a year, but because the procedure is so easy, subsequent treatments are effortless.

Is it expensive?

No. It's a fraction of the cost of a surgical procedure.

What kind of fillers are used?

Hyaluronic Acid gel such as QMed's Restylane, Perlane or Allergan's Juvederm Ultra.

Can the procedure be reversed?

Yes. A hyaluronic acid can be dissolved if you're not satisfied with the correction.

The finishing touch.

While the shape of your nose is undeniably important to the overall look of your face, so too is the condition of the skin on your nose.

PhotoDynamic Therapy (PDT) and Intense Pulsed Light (IPL), microdermabrasion, healthy diet, sunblock and supplements can all be used to treat UV damage. And these techniques are not just for the nose, they can be used for the whole face to achieve the best outcome in terms of visual aesthetics.

Signs of damage include pigmentation, redness, telangiectasias, Actinic Keratosis, enlarged pores and rough texture.
